Membership

It is required that applicants for membership are Caymanian citizens or permanent residents, status or work permit holders. Dependents (including children) must be also covered by a guardian holding one of the above.

Code of Conduct

We encourage a library service that is a pleasant, orderly and safe for purposes of leisure reading, learning or study; any act by an individual that disrupts or ignores this requirement, may result in loss of library privileges, including access, under the **Cayman Islands Public Library Law (1998 Revised)** until further notice.

Prohibited activities include:

Smoking or the use of tobacco products when on library property.

1. Using or being under the influence of alcohol or drugs when on library property.
2. Sleeping in the Library.
3. Solicitation or sale of any item, article, service, food or product of any kind whatsoever, unless approved by the Library.
4. Running inside the Library.
5. Purposely rearranging library materials or furniture.
6. Littering on Library property, or in any way defacing or vandalizing Library property.
7. Stealing, defacing, vandalizing or in any other way tampering with Library materials.
8. Engaging in conduct that violates Cayman Islands Law.
9. Loitering in the library building or on library property, including the parking lots.
10. Displaying or using language or gestures that a reasonable person would find inappropriate for use in a public library.
11. Sending, receiving, or displaying on library or personal computer screens any text or graphics that may reasonably be construed to be obscene or offensive to other patrons or to staff.
12. Engaging in any other behavior disturbing to library patrons or staff, endangering or harassing other persons, or preventing use of or damaging physical property.
